## *Fiancée Visa Checklist: 129F w/USCIS and Embassy Interview*

- Birth Certificates (with translation, if not in English):
  - U.S. Citizen sponsor
  - Non-Citizen Fiancée
  - Children
- All current & previous Marriage Certificates and Divorce Decrees (with translation, if necessary)
- Passport Photos:
  - 2 of Petitioner
  - 2 of Beneficiary
- Other proof of US Citizenship (Citizenship Certificate, Passport)
- Copies of all pages of all Passports, including visas and I-94 card from previous visits to the U.S. and to the Fiancée's country (front and back)
- Print out of Medical Exam information from Embassy
- Past 3 years of Income Tax Returns for U.S. Citizen
  - Or a statement explaining why you did not file taxes
  - 3 recent pay stubs for U.S. Citizen
  - Employment Verification letter for U.S. Citizen
- Copies of all previous applications, approval/refusal notices for USCIS and/or Embassy applications and work authorization cards
- Criminal convictions and arrest records (if any) of Non-Citizen
- Proof of your meeting within the last two years –
  - Airplane tickets/Travel Records
  - Photos
  - Letters of your good faith fiancée relationship and intent to marry from you (2), your friends (2) and family (2) – total 6.
- Intake forms and DS-260 Intake form

You have been referred to us by Sponsor and Fiancée because you have first-hand knowledge regarding Fiancée relationship to Sponsor and their intent to become Sponsor and Fiancée. At present Sponsor is preparing to apply for her fiancée immigrant visa and permanent resident card and she must prove that they entered the relationship in good faith and not just for the immigration benefit.

Please find enclosed a sample affidavit for you to use. We will be collecting affidavits from friends, family and neighbors who can state that they saw Sponsor and Fiancée together and believe their relationship and intent to marry is real.

The first paragraph introduces yourself and explains your relationship to Sponsor and Fiancée.

The second paragraph describes the situation where you saw Sponsor and Fiancée together, or that you have heard Sponsor discuss the relationship with you. You can also tell your opinion on their relationship.

The third paragraph states that you believe their intent to marry is real and not for an immigration purpose. You will then ask for USCIS to approve Fiancee's application for a visa to enter the US and eventually become a permanent resident.

The letters must be signed under penalty of perjury and before a notary. Thank you in advance for your valuable assistance in this matter. I remain,
